



## The injustice of god

Islam teaches that every single human being is born with 2 angels allocated to him for life. One angel is sitting on his right shoulder while the other one sits on his left. They will remain with him until he dies. It is their duty to record all the good as well as all the bad deed which a person commits during his lifetime. When that person dies his good deeds will be put on a scale. Then his bad deeds will be placed on the opposite site of that scale. If his good deeds outweigh all his bad deeds he will be allowed to enter Paradise. But if his bad deeds had been more numerous than his good deeds then he will be cast into hell.

This is not some silly 'fairy tale' or a laughing matter. 1 billion Muslims worldwide believe in this story!

But there is something seriously wrong with this story.

This idea of justice turns God into the most unjust, into the cruelest being of the entire universe.

There is something very wrong with this misguided concept of justice.

Muslims believe that Allah has many names and that one of his names is: 'THE JUST ONE' but this concept of justice has nothing to do with true justice at all. It actually turns Allah into a monster.

And here is the reason why:

A man loved his wife very dearly. But one day his wife was brutally raped by another man. After the cruel and brutal rape this man proceeded to beat up the woman as well. He hit into her without any mercy until she was laying on the ground with serious injuries. As she was laying there, suffering in great pain from the effects of that terrible beating and from that horrible rape the man pulled out his knife. Then he slowly started to cut her throat. He did it in slow motion so that he would inflict maximum pain on the poor suffering woman. Hours later the woman finally died.

The next day the man was caught and put in prison.

On the day of his trial he had a very skilled lawyer who pleaded his case. When his crime was read out the judge was ready to pass on the maximum sentence. He wanted to hang this man for his terrible crime.

But then the man's skillful lawyer started to make his defense.

He explained to the judge as well as to everyone else in the courtroom that the accused had always been an exemplary person for most of his life. He had never hurt or harmed anyone before until he had met that woman. He showed the judge pictures of his 6 Foster children which this man had adopted. He showed the judge receipts of the many thousands of dollars which he had given to charities over the years. He had always been kind and helpful to his neighbors and to everyone else. He was loved and appreciated by everyone in his community. Anyone who had ever known him knew him as a very good man. He had done so many good things in his life. He was kind, he was giving and he was always willing to help. He had even received metals of honor for his charitable works in the past.

When the judge looked at this man's history he passed judgment with the following words:

“Because you have been such a good person for most of your life, because you have done so much good in the past, you have been such a great asset to the community around you and you have done far more good than bad I will allow you go free. Your life reflects many good works and there is only 1 single crime which stands against you. It is clear from your record that you are not a bad person and that you deserve to be set free”.

And so the rapist, the murderer walked away a free man.

How would you have felt if you would have been the husband of that poor murdered wife? You would have been overcome with furious anger about the terrible injustice which took place in that courtroom. You would have hated that judge for his incredible injustice!

When a judge fails to administer justice he administers injustice instead. A judge that administers injustice can never be neutral himself. He actually shares in the guilt of the offender!

A young Iraqi asylum seeker brutally raped a 10 year old boy in a public pool outside of Vienna. The Iraqi man raped that young boy so badly that the child was seriously injured after the brutal attack. The man was eventually caught and convicted. He pleaded ‘not guilty’ and his excuse in court was that: “it was a sexual emergency”. He received a 6 year jail sentence for this terrible crime.

But his lawyer did not give up and his case eventually ended up in the high court where there was a re-trial. The judge in the ‘high court’ decided that the incident did not amount to a genuine rape and so he allowed the rapist to go free.

Imagine the father of that poor child and imagine the child. First he became the victim of this terrible rape and then he became the victim of the most incredible injustice. What happened in that high court amounted to such a national disgrace that it put the whole country to shame!

This judge was not neutral in this crime. By the very fact that he had administered such terrible injustice he himself now shares a part of the guilt of this crime!

But this is exactly what Allah is doing according to the words of the Quran.

When you read the Quran you will realize that Allah does not administer ‘mercy’ but that he inflicts the gravest injustice of all.

If the ‘good’ works of a man can ‘outweigh’ his evil deeds and allow a person to go free, justice has been mocked beyond all limits!

If this is supposed to present justice and determine a person’s eternal future then the great judge himself (Allah) has administered the greatest injustice of all.

What if he would allow the murderer, the rapist to go free (the judge in Austria did) because the accused who stands before him has always said his ‘5 daily prayers’, has been on his

pilgrimage to Mecca and has faithfully kept all the other rules of his religion. This would amount to the ultimate mockery of human justice!

Such a god would be incredibly unjust. He would be no different to the judge who allowed the rapist to go free in Vienna. A god that administers such terribly injustice can never be god!!!

Most of us believe that they are not a bad person at heart. The far majority of us believe that they are basically good people at heart.

Even a criminal will defend himself the very same way. We don't like to see that there is something wrong with us and so we build our defense.

Our defense is usually always built on the same foundation: "I am not a bad person".

Even the most brutal dictators in history used that same foundation to justify their evil actions.

But to believe that 'being a good person' would one day give us entrance into heaven (most are not even sure that this place even exists) is to call God the most unjust judge of the universe.

If we can earn heaven by our good works then God is no different to the judge who allowed the murderer, the rapist to go free. He is just like the judge in Vienna who pardoned the rapist without any obvious reason!

If God would allow us into heaven because of our 'good works' He would have to overlook all the wrong that we have ever done in the past.

He would have to ignore all the wrong and illegal things that we did in the past.

What if we had taken something which belonged to somebody else?

The victim of this theft would have lost out in more ways than 1.

First he became the victim of theft but after that he also becomes the victim of injustice for he was denied true justice in court.

An older lady had this same idea about life.

She had always believed that she was a good person. But at the same time she cheated her government for many tens of thousands of dollars over many years in welfare payments which she was not entitled to. Someone else had to earn this money. Someone else had to get up every morning and go to work in order to pay the taxes that were needed to support this woman's dishonest actions. Someone else had to work in order to pay for this woman's welfare payments that she was not entitled to!

This woman may have been a good person in many other ways but she was still a thief.

If God would close his eyes and allow her to get away with this theft He himself would do great injustice (in this case to an entire nation which had its money stolen from a dishonest woman).

His injustice would pardon a woman to get away with her dishonest actions without ever having brought to justice for her theft. Only a truly unjust god would act in this way!

If God would do such a thing then He himself would stand accused before an entire nation which had been cheated of their money. First God pardons the thief without bringing him to justice and then He himself would cheat the whole nation of justice!

If human courts would act in this way there would be chaos in the world around us.

Imagine that you have seriously broken the speed limit and you end up in court. You have driven through a red light, then you went 100 kilometers over the speed limit in a 'safety zone'

and you plead 'not guilty' because you have always been a 'good person'. And as a result of your defense the judge lets you go because he too believes that you have been a good person and that because of this you do not deserve to be judged for your offense. This would make a complete mockery of justice. No judge on earth would fall for such a defense and yet we believe that God, the creator of the universe would fall for such a cheap excuse? This only shows how much we have deceived ourselves!

God according to the Bible is a just God.

His justice demands that every single crime will get punished one day. It does not matter how many good deeds a person has done in the past, none of his good deeds will ever get him off the hook in the future.

One day he will have to stand before God and he will have to pay for his crimes.

He could have been someone like mother Theresa or anyone else who appeared to be devoted to helping others in need but he will still have to pay for his sin that he has committed.

God will not allow a 'trade-off' and let him off the hook because of something 'good' that he has done in the past.

True justice demands that every 'sin' has to get punished one day.

There can be no exceptions!

I am sure that God will look favorably upon a man's good works but good works can never remove the guilt of a person.

And before God we are all guilty.

God's standard has been set out very plain and clear in his Commandments (the 10 Commandments).

We have all told a lie (which makes us a liar). We have all taken something that does not belong to us (which makes us a thief). We have all used Gods name in vein (how often have you used the name of the Lord without even thinking about it?)

As you go through the commandments 1 by 1 you will realize that you are guilty on many accounts.

We may have never murdered anyone but we are still guilty for whoever breaks 1 of God's commandments has broken them all. Guilt is guilt and we are all guilty before God.

If one of the angels on our shoulders (as Muslims believe) suddenly takes a book to God and reads out all the nice and good things that we did in the past and God overlooks all the wrong we have done, it would turn God into an unjust monster, into a God who has broken His own laws.

This would prove that His laws had no meaning at all but that God himself had become guilty of breaking His laws for He would have administered injustice which is totally contrary to Him being perfectly 'just'.

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God cannot break His own laws. The entire universe rests upon His universal laws. And because God has to follow through on His word we are guilty before Him.

Because God is just He cannot allow guilt to go unpunished.

Guilt, sin (which is the equivalent to crime in God's eyes) has to be punished one day.

If He would not punish sin He would not be a 'just' God. His justice demands that sin gets punished!

The punishment for sin is eternal separation from Him and from His future creation.

The Bible calls His future creation 'heaven'.

Heaven will have many similarities to earth except that it will be completely unspoiled and unpolluted by 'sin'.

But because we are guilty we can never get there!

Heaven is a place which is completely out of our reach for us all!

Eternal separation from God is called 'hell' in the Bible.

Hell is a place of darkness, a place of eternal remorse. It contains none of the beauty of God's creation which we have become so accustomed to here on this earth, which most of us have taken for granted.

Hell is our final destiny for there has to be justice. None of us have lived a perfect and a sinless life, a life which is truly acceptable to God.

None of us has earned the right by their 'good works' to live in God's presence forever.

Every religious founder was guilty of sin.

Buddha was not perfect which is why he was seeking Nirvana. He was looking for a way to escape the suffering of life in the future.

Mohammad was not sinless (even thou many Muslims like to think so but they fail to read about his life and his conduct as recorded in their own books)

But there was 1 man who lived a life that was completely 'sinless', that was truly acceptable to God, right from his birth up to his death. His name was Jesus.

If you seriously study the 4 gospels you will not find 1 single incident where you could accuse Jesus of 1 single sin.

He was the only one who has lived the perfect sinless life. His life was the only life which was acceptable to God.

No one before him and no one after him had ever lived a blameless life like he did.

And at the peak of his life he surrendered his life for the sake of our salvation.

He died the most cruel and painful death on a cross!

He, the only sinless person died the death that we have deserved.

He died for our sins!

This is why we call him Christ, savior, because he is the only one who is able to save us from sin!

Sin cannot be abolished by works or by anything else. Religious leaders in the past have tried to show us a path to salvation but not one of them has been able to save us from sin. Unless we are saved from sins we cannot find a secure eternal future because we will have to face the divine judge in the future.

The blood of Jesus contains the power to wash away our sins ( **Rev. 1:5**): ...Jesus Christ, the faithful witness, the firstborn from the dead, and the ruler of the kings of the earth. To Him who loves us and has released us from our sins by His blood,

**Eph. 1:7** In Him we have redemption through His blood, the forgiveness of our trespasses, according to the riches of His grace

The choices are simple, we can stand before God one day and give account for every single sin that we have ever committed and face his divine judgment as a result, a judgment from which there can be no escape or we come to him who is able to save us from our sins and stand before him one day in the future instead. "For we (those who have been set free from their sins and have chosen to follow their savior) shall all stand before the judgment seat of Christ."- Romans 14:10 KJV

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#### Of the judgment to come:

And I saw the dead, great and small, standing before the throne. And there were open books, and one of them was the book of life. And the dead were judged according to their deeds, as recorded in the books. [Rev. 20:12](#)

For God will bring every act to judgment, everything which is hidden, whether it is good or evil. [Ecclesiastes 12:14](#)
